In accordance with Section 10 subsection 1 of the higher education admissions act (Gesetz über die Zulassung zum Hochschulstudium in Hamburg, HZG) dated 28 December 2004 (HmbGVBl. p. 515), the Executive University Board of the University of Hamburg ratified the Revised Bylaws Regarding the Selection Procedure and Criteria for the Degree Programs in the Faculty of Humanities.

Section 1

Scope

- (1) In accordance with the HZG and the admission bylaws of University of Hamburg dated 16 July 2005 (Universitätszulassungssatzung, UniZS) (official government gazette p. 1730) as amended, these bylaws govern the selection of applicants applying for first-year student placement (Section 6 subsection 1 no. 1 and subsection 2 no. 1 UniZS) in restricted-admission degree programs or degree components offered by the faculty that are not included in the university place allocation procedure of the Central Office for Allocating Admissions (ZVS). The bylaws also apply to the selection of international applicants for degree programs included in the university place allocation procedure of the Central Office.
- (2) Furthermore, these bylaws also apply to the selection of applicants for a higher subject semester (Section 2 subsection 2 UniZS) in restricted-admission degree programs or degree components as well as restricted-admission consecutive master's degree programs offered by the faculty.
- (3) Supplementary rules for the selection procedure and criteria for individual degree programs are set forth in the appendix. The appendix is subdivided into the following:
 - A. Undergraduate degree programs
 - B. Consecutive master's degree programs

The degree programs are numbered consecutively.

Section 2

Selection of applicants pursuant to Section 6 subsection 2 number 1 UniZS

- (1) The places available for first-year students pursuant to Section 6 subsection 2 number 1 UniZS will be awarded in accordance with the grade point average of the higher education entrance eligibility, unless otherwise provided for in the appendix.
- (2) An advance quota will be established up to and including the application procedure for the summer semester 2008 (Section 9 subsection 6 UniZS) for applicants who have acquired a higher education entrance qualification pursuant to Section 38 HmbHG that does not show an average grade determined to one decimal place within a six-level grading system. Of the places available pursuant to Section 6 subsection 2 number 1 of the bylaws of the University of Hamburg for admission (Universitätszulassungssatzung, UniZS), 3 percent are reserved for winter semester 2005/2006 and the following summer semester 2006; 2 percent for winter semester 2006/2007 and the following summer semester 2007; and 1 percent for winter semester 2007/2008, with a minimum of 1 place being available.

Section 3

Selection of international applicants

International applicants (Section 7 subsection 1 UniZS) are selected in accordance with the provisions of Section 7 subsections 2 and 3 UniZS.

Section 4

Selection of applicants for a higher subject semester

- (1) Unless otherwise provided in the appendix, available places (Section 16 subsection 1 UniZS) for a higher subject semester are allocated as follows
 1. 50 percent in accordance with performance rendered during the previous degree program—in the event of equivalent performance, in accordance with the grade point average of the higher education entrance eligibility

2. 50 percent in accordance with the grade point average of the higher education entrance eligibility—in the event of the same grade point average then in accordance with performance rendered during the previous degree program
- (2) The ratio set forth in subsection 1 number 1 has precedence over the ratio in subsection 1 number 2.

Section 5

Selection of applicants for a consecutive master's degree program

According to Section 18 UniZS, applicants for a consecutive master's program are selected based on the result from the first higher education degree and where performance is equivalent based on the grade point average of the higher education entrance eligibility, unless otherwise provided for in the Appendix.

Section 6

Reasonable accommodations

Reasonable accommodations will be granted on application where a student can demonstrate that disability has resulted in disadvantage against other applicants in selection and selection criteria. The disability representative must be consulted pursuant to Section 88 subsection 3 HmbHG.

Section 7

Effective date

The bylaws come into force at the same time as the University of Hamburg's bylaws on admission to studies dated 16 June 2005. They first apply for admissions to Winter Semester 2005/06

I. Appendix

A. Undergraduate degree programs

[Passage with the heading “Bachelor’s degree program in Systematic Musicology” deleted. (Amendment dated 2 May 2012)]

1. Integrated German-French History degree program with double degree Bachelor of Arts/ Licence Sciences humaines et sociales/mention “Geschichte/Histoire” (HAMBORD)
If the number of applications meeting the special conditions of admission exceeds the number of places available for the bachelor’s degree program named above, places will be awarded as follows:
 - a) a maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility. Applications with the same results will be selected by drawing lots.
 - b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must include a CV, a bilingual letter of motivation outlining the reasons, goals, and interests for choosing the degree program and proof of language proficiency in French and German at level B2 and, if applicable, in Latin to the extent of the minor proficiency certificate in Latin (intermediate Latin certificate).
 - c) On the basis of the portfolios, the joint commission, as the selection committee for both universities, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications for the degree program, conducts personal interviews with the selected applicants (using video technology if necessary).
 - d) After all oral interviews have been completed, the selection committee makes the overall selection for all available university places.
 - e) The main findings of the selection procedure and the selection interviews, in particular the weighting of the individual criteria determined by the selection committee, must be recorded.

B. Master’s degree program in

1. Northern European Studies
If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the Northern European Studies master’s degree program, selection is based on:
 - a) A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
 - b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
 - c) The selection committee, passed by two lecturers with examiner qualifications for the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places based on the portfolios. In cases of doubt, it may also conduct a 20 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.
 - d) The material findings from the selection procedure and any interviews must be recorded.

2. Master's degree in Language Teaching Research
- If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the Language Teaching Research master's degree program, selection is based on:
- A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
 - The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
 - The selection committee, passed by two lecturers with examiner qualifications for the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places based on the portfolios. In particular, consideration is given to the overall and individual grades, linguistic focus, and educational quality of the university for the undergraduate degree. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 20 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.
- The material findings from the selection procedure and any interviews must be recorded.

3. -not required-

4. Master's degree in Philosophy
- If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the Philosophy master's degree program, selection is based on:
- A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
 - The selected applicants will be asked to submit a two-page synopsis. The exposé should provide information about the motivation to study the Philosophy master's program at the University of Hamburg against the background of the undergraduate degree in which the professional qualification was obtained.
 - On the basis of the exposé, a 15-minute selection interview will be conducted by 2 lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program for a final assessment of the applicant's suitability and motivation.
 - The head of the Department of Philosophy is responsible for the overall selection decision for all available university places. The decision is made on the basis of a proposal from the teachers involved in the selection procedure.
 - The main findings of the selection procedure, in particular the weighting of the individual criteria determined by the selection committee, must be recorded.

5. Master's degree in Japanese Studies
- If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the Japanese Studies master's degree program, selection is based on:
- A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
 - The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant

individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.

- c) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.
- d) The main findings of the selection procedure and any selection interviews, in particular the weighting of the individual criteria determined by the selection committee, must be recorded.

6. Master's degree in Sinology

If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the Sinology master's degree program, selection is based on:

- a) A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
- b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
- c) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.

If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
- b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
- c) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.

8. European master's degree in Austronesian Studies

If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the Austronesian Studies master's degree program, selection is based on:

- a) A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
 - b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
 - c) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.
 - d) The main findings of the selection procedure and any selection interviews, in particular the weighting of the individual criteria determined by the selection committee, must be recorded.
9. European master's degree program in Vietnamese Studies

- a) A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
 - b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
 - c) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.

If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
- b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
- c) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.

15. International master's degree in Turkish Studies

The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
- c) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.

16. Master's degree Documentation of African Languages (MAD)
If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the Documentation of African Languages (MAD) master's degree program, selection is based on:
- a) A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
 - b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
 - c) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.
 - d) The main findings of the selection procedure and any selection interviews, in particular the weighting of the individual criteria determined by the selection committee, must be recorded.
17. Master's degree in African Languages in Context (MAC)
- a) If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the African Languages in Context (MAC) master's degree program, selection is based on:
 - b) A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
 - c) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
 - d) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.
 - e) The main findings of the selection procedure and any selection interviews, in particular the weighting of the individual criteria determined by the selection committee, must be recorded.

18. Master's degree in Ethiopian Studies
- If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the Ethiopian Studies master's degree program, selection is based on:
- a) A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
 - b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant

individual grades of the undergraduate degree, the study profile and information on the linguistic specialization.

- c) The selection committee, consisting of two lecturers with examiner qualifications from the degree program, makes the overall selection for all available university places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.
- d) The main findings of the selection procedure and any selection interviews, in particular the weighting of the individual criteria determined by the selection committee, must be recorded in a protocol

19. Master's degree in Language and Culture of Modern Greece (Modern Greek Studies)

If the number of applications for the Master's degree program in Literature, Language and Culture of Modern Greece (Modern Greek Studies) exceeds the number of available university places, the selection will be made according to :

- a) the results of the first higher education degree;
- b) letter of motivation

The letter of motivation (length: one DIN A4 page), should present the applicant's reasons for choosing the degree program at the University of Hamburg and document their basic knowledge of the history of Modern Greek literature (epochs, authors).

The letter of motivation is evaluated according to the grading scale in accordance with Section 15 of the Examination Regulations of the Faculty of Humanities for degree programs leading to the Bachelor of Arts/Baccalaurea Artium or Baccalaureus Artium (B.A.).

The selection criteria a) and b) are each weighted at 50%.

The material findings from the selection procedure must be recorded.

20. Master's degree in Multilingual Educational Linguistics (MOTION)

If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the Multilingual Educational Linguistics (MOTION) master's degree program, selection is based on:

- (1) the results of the first higher education degree

The criterion according to point (1) can be increased by 0.1 each for recognition of prior achievements according to points (2)–(4):

- (2) relevant professional or internship experience in the field of multilingualism and/or intercultural pedagogy;
- (3) term papers or a final thesis in the fields of multilingualism and/or intercultural pedagogy;
- (4) publications in the fields of multilingualism and/or intercultural pedagogy.

21. Master's program in Buddhist Studies

If applications satisfying the special admission requirements exceed the number of places available for selection for the International M.A. Program in Buddhist Studies, selection is based on:

- a) A maximum of twice as many applicants than available places will be selected according to the final grade obtained in the first degree. If two applicants have the same grade, the grade obtained in the higher education entrance eligibility will be decisive. If this is also the same, selection will be by lottery.
- b) The selected applicants will be asked to submit a portfolio. The portfolio must contain a CV, the academic achievements to date with average grade as well as the relevant individual grades of the first degree, the study profile, any special language skills and a justification of the choice of study and career goal.
- c) Based on the portfolios, the degree program selection committee makes the overall selection for all available University places. In cases of doubt, the committee may also conduct a 15 to 30-minute interview with individual applicants.

- d) The material findings from the selection procedure and any interviews must be recorded.

22. Master's degree program in Latin American Studies

If the number of applications meeting the special conditions of admission exceeds the number of places available for the Latin American Studies master's degree program, places will be awarded as follows:

- a) the results of the first higher education degree;
- b) the relationship of the content of the first higher education degree to Latin American Studies and
- c) the applicant's relevant experience with the Latin America region.

Selection criterion a) must be proven by the degree certificate, selection criterion b) by a transcript of records or a comparable presentation of the course content and skills acquired, selection criterion c) by a CV and, if applicable, other attached documents that prove the relevant experience in Latin America, such as relevant professional experience or longer stays abroad in the region.

Criteria b) and c) are assessed according to the grading scale in accordance with Section 15 of the currently valid Examination Regulations of the Faculty of Humanities for degree programs leading to the Bachelor of Arts/Baccalaurea or Baccalaureus Artium (B.A.). Selection criteria a), b) and c) are each weighted 1/3.

The material findings from the selection procedure must be recorded.

24. Master's degree in Eastern European Studies

If the number of applications meeting the special conditions of admission exceeds the number of places available for the Eastern European Studies master's degree program, places will be awarded as follows:

- a) the results of the first higher education degree;
- b) the relationship of the content of the first higher education degree to Eastern European Studies and
- c) the applicant's relevant experience with the Eastern European region.

Selection criterion a) must be proven by the degree certificate, selection criterion b) by a transcript of records or a comparable presentation of the course content and skills acquired, selection criterion c) by a CV and, if applicable, other attached documents that prove the relevant experience in Eastern Europe, such as relevant professional experience or longer stays abroad in the region.

Criteria b) and c) are assessed according to the grading scale in accordance with Section 15 of the currently valid Examination Regulations of the Faculty of Humanities for degree programs leading to the Bachelor of Arts/Baccalaurea or Baccalaureus Artium (B.A.). Selection criteria a), b) and c) are each weighted 1/3.

The material findings from the selection procedure must be recorded.
