TENURE-TRACK-PROFESSORSHIP (W1 TENURE-TRACK LEADING TO A W2) FOR INTERNATIONAL LAW WITH A FOCUS ON BEHAVIORAL LAW AND ECONOMICS

commencing on **1 August 2018, ref. no. JP 283.**

Responsibilities:

The successful candidate is responsible for courses in the field of international law and behavioral economics. Courses are to be held in German and English. Further responsibilities include interdisciplinary research on international law topics and cooperation at the Institute of Law and Economics (IRÖ).

Section 12 subsection 7 sentence 2 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG) applies.

Requirements:

Academic qualifications and additional requirements as specified in Section 18 HmbHG.

Further criteria:

Applicants are expected to have international research experience as well as a successful track record in acquiring external funding and carrying out externally funded projects. The University places particular emphasis on the quality of teaching and therefore requests that applicants provide details of their teaching experience and objectives.

We are seeking an internationally recognized and well-connected applicant with international credentials in international and European law and a background in economics including behavioral economics. We especially value knowledge of the foundations of law, such as legal theory. A degree in economics is advantageous.

Experience abroad and interdisciplinary cooperation is desirable.

The successful candidate is expected to contribute actively to the development of the Faculty's international law and behavioral economics research profile, to pursue interdisciplinary cooperation in research and teaching, and to collaborate at the Faculty's Institute of Law and Economics at Universität Hamburg.

The post holder is expected to acquire the language skills necessary to teach in German (Level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) within two years of commencing employment providing he or she does not have the requisite skills when starting.

Junior professors have academic autonomy in their research and teaching. To ensure synergies in research and teaching, applicants' subject interests are expected to relate to topics in the area of Law and Economics.

A tenure-track evaluation will be conducted during the second phase of the junior professorship in order to determine whether requirements for appointment to a W2 professorship have been met. Section 15 HmbHG applies. If the evaluation is positive, the candidate will be offered a tenured W2 professorship. The regulations prohibiting internal appointments (*Hausberufungsverbot*) also apply to this junior professorship.

In accordance with Section 14 subsection 3 sentence 3 HmbHG, Universität Hamburg seeks to increase the proportion of women in teaching and research and encourages female academics to apply.

Qualified disabled candidates or applicants with equivalent status receive preference in the application process.
