JUNIOR PROFESSORSHIP (W1) FOR BEHAVIORAL LAW AND ECONOMICS

commencing on **1 August 2018, ref. no. JP 284.**

Responsibilities:

The successful candidate is expected to teach and conduct research in the economic analysis of law.

The successful candidate is further expected to apply state-of-the-art empirical research methods towards new findings in the economic analysis of law and to teach these methods to students.

Section 12 subsection 7 sentence 2 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG) applies.

Requirements:

Academic qualifications and additional requirements as specified in Section 18 HmbHG.

Further criteria:

Applicants are expected to demonstrate a successful track record in acquiring external funding and carrying out externally funded projects.

They are also required to have teaching experience, particularly in the field of empirical methods. The Faculty welcomes familiarity with teaching courses for students from various disciplines. The University places particular emphasis on the quality of teaching and therefore requests that applicants provide details of their teaching experience and objectives.

Applicants should demonstrate thorough knowledge of empirical law and economics as well as quantitative empirical research methods, including behavioral economics and experimental research (field and lab). Sound knowledge of both political economy and new institutional economics is also desirable.

Applicants should bring extensive academic experience, proven by publications in international peer-reviewed journals. Candidates' research foci should clearly lie in the field of empirical law and economics. In addition to interdisciplinary methods, the Faculty of Law also focuses on

international legal questions. Thus we particularly welcome research that takes a comparative approach to different countries and economic investigations into international law.

The post holder is expected to acquire the language skills necessary to teach in German (Level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) within two years of commencing employment providing he or she does not have the requisite skills when starting.

Junior professors have academic autonomy in their research and teaching. To ensure synergies in research and teaching, applicants' subject interests are expected to relate to topics in the area of Law and Economics.

In accordance with Section 14 subsection 3 sentence 3 HmbHG, Universität Hamburg seeks to increase the proportion of women in teaching and research and encourages female academics to apply.

Qualified disabled candidates or applicants with equivalent status receive preference in the application process.
