Wasserkunst: The Art and History of Water in Hamburg

Can you imagine what life would be like if we couldn't drink the tap water? Luckily, the quality of the tap water in Hamburg today is high, and the water is fresh and healthy. But how did this come to be? In the nineteenth century, the tap water in Hamburg had a bad reputation, and it took decades for the state parliament and senate to reach a decision to build a central filtering system. Finally, an island named Kaltehofe was created in the Elbe River and used as a water filtration and purification center until 1990. This is a great opportunity to get to know more about the history of water in Hamburg! Join us and learn more about the beginnings of the water purification system in Hamburg.
