The position in accordance with Section 28 subsection 3 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG) commences on October 15th 2019.

This is a fixed-term contract in accordance with Section 2 of the academic fixed-term labor contract act (Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz, WissZeitVG). The term is fixed for a period of 3 years. The position calls for 100 % of standard work hours per week**.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Duties primarily include teaching and research. Research associates may also pursue independent research and further academic qualifications.

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

Duties include teaching within the areas of Differential Psychology and Psychological Assessment (3.5 LVS) and contributing to the group's ongoing research projects (in particular an ongoing multicenter study focussing on EEG-personality associations; please find a German description of the project here: <https://gepris.dfg.de/gepris/projekt/409321828>). Besides participating in planning and conducting empirical studies, research associates are expected to contribute to international publications as both first and co-author.

REQUIREMENTS:

A university degree in a relevant field. Excellent English language skills. Experience with university level teaching, biopsychological research methods (e.g., EEG, fMRI, tDCS, peripheral physiological measurements), with programming experimental paradigms (e.g. using Presentation) and/or analysis routines (e.g. using Matlab and R) as well as with the principles of Open Science are desirable.

* Full-time positions currently comprise 39 hours per week.

The University aims to increase the number of women in research and teaching and explicitly encourages qualified women to apply. Equally qualified female applicants will receive preference in accordance with the Hamburg act on gender equality (Hamburgisches Gleichstellungsgesetz, HmbGleiG).
