The position in accordance with Section 28 subsection 3 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG) commences on 1 January 2021.

This is a fixed-term contract in accordance with Section 2 of the academic fixed-term labor contract act (Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz, WissZeitVG). The term is fixed until 31 July 2023. The position calls for 50 % of standard work hours per week\*\*.

### RESPONSIBILITIES:

Duties include academic services in the project named above. Research associates may also pursue independent research and further academic qualifications.

### SPECIFIC DUTIES:

The research associate will work with Prof. Dr. Anne van Aaken at the Institute of Law and Economics in the project "Economics and Psychology of International Law/Legal Theory". This will include research from an interdisciplinary and economic perspective on issues of public international law with focus on international organizations and behavioral economics. The research associate will also assist in research projects of the Institute, including co-publications with a focus on International Organizations and (behavioral) economics.

### REQUIREMENTS:

A university degree in a relevant field. Preferred is a law degree with some background in economics. An excellent command of English is mandatory. Experience in international or European Organizations is an asset. We expect applications from a strong candidate with an interest in the subject areas mentioned above.
